Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

This year the service for the Swords Area will take place in St. Columba's Church, Church Road on Friday 22nd January at 8:00pm. It will be led by the Rector of St. Columba's Canon Robert Deane, with the prayers and reading being shared by members of the faith communities in Swords.

The Week of Prayer is an important time for us to gather and pray as people of this area united with the Christian Churches around the world who do the same.

During the past year the World Council of Churches has published *The Church: Towards a Common Vision*. It invites us all to discuss and reflect together what it means to be the Church in the world, both in terms of our journey to unity and our mission to the world. Yet, it is becoming almost fashionable to suggest that Christian unity is the agenda of yesterday whereas today's and tomorrow's agenda is about mission. As though the two were mutually exclusive!

Throughout the nations of Britain and Ireland there are countless examples of how the churches together are working and praying for unity and coming together in service to their community and in mission and evangelism. Unity and mission belong together.

The churches of Latvia have brought these matters forward for our reflection in this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. They draw attention to the words of Jesus in Matthew's Gospel which tells us that as his disciples we are to be light to the world, and salt of the earth: the very things that as human beings we cannot live without, and therefore without the Gospel, without the promise of the good news of God's love in Christ, the world is lost.

This year we are given the opportunity to reflect upon our Christian vocation to be salt and light, to be one in Christ, and to work together in service to our local community and to the world.

WHAT IS THE EXTRAORDINARY JUBILEE OF MERCY ALL ABOUT?

On **Tuesday 26**th **January** at 7:30pm in the Pastoral Centre there will be a evening to explore the main themes of what this year sets out to do.

We will look at the document Misericordiae Vultus, which is Pope Francis' letter for this year, there will be some discussion, a time of reflection and out of this a question as what opportunities should there be in our Parish to celebrate this year.

Copies of the Pope Letter will be available on the night as well as the Year of Mercy packs from the Dublin Diocese.



"For his mercy endures forever." This is the refrain that repeats after each verse in Psalm 136 as it narrates the history of God's revelation. By virtue of mercy, all the events of the Old Testament are replete with profound salvific import. Mercy renders God's history with Israel a history of salvation. To repeat continually "for his mercy endures forever," as the psalm does, seems to break through the dimensions of space and time, inserting everything into the eternal mystery of love. It is as if to say that not only in history, but for all eternity man will always be under the merciful gaze of the Father. It is no accident that the people of Israel wanted to include this psalm – the "Great Hallel," as it is called – in its most important liturgical feast days.

Before his Passion, Jesus prayed with this psalm of mercy. Matthew attests to this in his Gospel when he says that, "when they had sung a hymn" (26:30), Jesus and his disciples went out to the Mount of Olives. While he was instituting the Eucharist as an everlasting memorial of himself and his paschal sacrifice, he symbolically placed this supreme act of revelation in the light of his mercy. Within the very same context of mercy, Jesus entered upon his passion and death, conscious of the great mystery of love that he would consummate on the Cross. Knowing that Jesus himself prayed this psalm makes it even more important for us as Christians, challenging us to take up the refrain in our daily lives by praying these words of praise: "for his mercy endures forever." Paragraph 7.
