





Praying with God's Word

Out of the week of Guided Prayer, many talked about the experience of the readings coming alive in a new way. They became about people and how they lived their lives as people who believed in and met God in their daily lives. They found that having the time to read, reflect and read again the particular passage gave them a whole new understanding and appreciation of what was going on. Often at Mass they would hear the same reading but because they were only hearing it and then moving on, the message was missed. The group asked that we would put the references for the upcoming readings at Sunday Mass in the newsletter so that they could have the opportunity to read them. Below are the readings for Holy Week, Easter and the Second Sunday after Easter:

Holy Thursday: First Reading Exodus (Ex.) 12:1-18, 11-14; Second Reading 1st Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians (1Cor) 11:23-26; Gospel John (Jn) 13:1-15.

Good Friday: First Reading Isaiah (Is.) 52:13-53:12; Second Reading Letter to the Hebrews (Heb) 4:14-16, 5:7-9; Gospel John (Jn.) 18:1-19:42 Easter Vigil: Old Testament Readings: Genesis (Gn) 1:1-2:2; Exodus (Ex) 14:15-15:1; Ezekiel 36:16-28; New Testament: Letter of St. Paul to the Romans (Rom.) 6:3-11; Gospel: Matthew (Mt.) 28:1-10

Easter Sunday: First Reading Acts of the Apostles (Acts) 10:34, 37-43; Second Reading: St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians (Col.) 3:1-4; Gospel John (Jn.) 20:1-9

Second Sunday of Easter: First Reading Acts of the Apostles (Acts) 2:42-27; Second Reading 1st Letter of St. Peter (1Pet) 1:3-9; Gospel John (Jn.) 20:19-31


Fingal Student Enterprise


