

Particularly at a time of increasing energy prices and concerns about what the onset of winter will bring, many will be anxious to see what supports for households the government will offer in this week's budget. However, there is always a 'Lazarus' in our midst, someone who needs our time, support, practical assistance or encouragement. Many of our brothers and sisters in different parts of the world live in situations of great poverty and deprivation. The question which today's Gospel poses is, are we even aware of them?



This Sunday is Diocesan Safeguarding Sunday. The safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults is the responsibility of each of us in the parish. Mary-Liz Donaghue, our parish Safeguarding Representative, will speak at the 6.00pm Mass on Saturday evening and 11.00am Mass on Sunday. A summary Statement of our Parish Safeguarding Policy is available at the main entrance to the church. Feel free to take one with you. All parish volunteers are asked to complete a volunteer application form and sign a code of conduct form every three years. A copy of these forms are available from the parish office. We appreciate your cooperation in filling out these forms which form part of our parish commitment to the safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults.

On Monday 26/09/22 Brackenstown Scripture study group will commence a 10 week study of St Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. The Scripture Study group meets from 7.30 to 9pm on Monday nights in St. Cronan's Pastoral Centre. New members are always welcome even if it just to attend for a week or two to see if it might suit you.

St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians addresses many of the same topics in the news headlines today: scandals, promiscuity, debates and controversies, and issues related to prosperity versus poverty. Clearly, the struggles faced by the early Christians are in many ways similar to



our own. First Corinthians: The Church and the Christian Community explores the key elements of the gospel message that Paul introduced to a new and growing Church. Presenter Tim Gray examines Paul's advice for living an authentic Christian life in a pagan culture, as well as his teachings about the nature of grace, the Church as the body of Christ, and the most powerful gift of all—the Eucharist.
