ROSARY



Praying with God's Word

Below are the readings for next Sunday:



11th Sunday of Easter: First Reading: Ezekiel 17:22-24; Psalm 91; Second Reading:

2 Corinthians 5:6-10; Gospel Mark 4:26-34

Nativity of John the Baptist: First Reading: Isaiah 49:1-6; Psalm: 138; Second Reading: Acts 13:22-26; Gospel: Luke 1:57-66, 80.



Faith for Life is a Diocesan led course run over 4 weekends or movements during the year and is based in Clonliffe College, Drumcondra. The course is run in conjunction with the Archdiocese of Liverpool and aims to deepen the connection between faith and everyday life. The key elements of the four movements included: connecting to God in everyday life, compassionate listening, understanding scripture, Catholic Social Teaching, spirituality and different forms of praying including Ignatian Spirituality and meditation.

Last year 3 people from the parish, Doreen Keaney, Teresa McQuillan & Louise Donnelly, attended the course which was facilitated by a team including our Parish Pastoral Worker, Peter Siney. As part of the course our local group under the heading of "Social Justice" undertook the project of setting up the Humpty Dumpty Playgroup, which is now running successfully with new members.




The course strengthened bonds between participants and gave us the opportunity to understand how a vibrant faith community can impact on society overall.

Being part of God's community all things are possible. It is important to individually take time to listen to God and as Catherine of Siena said "Be who God meant you to be, and you will set the world on fire". This means being present to God in our daily lives and listening compassionately to everyone we encounter daily.

This course is ideal for individuals or for members from a group or committee within the parish and we thoroughly recommend it, starting on 6th October 2018.

It will be a great faith enriching experience. In addition to personal experience, the interaction with members of the larger group will give an understanding of the experiences of other parishes and the challenges they face.

Swords Cemetery Sunday – Sunday 24th June at 4.00pm: This Mass (with the participation of the Choir) will take place in St. Colmcille's Church. Before the final blessing, I will pray a prayer of blessing for all buried in the Cemetery. This is always a significant event in our parish Calendar and is an important annual occasion, therefore as you would expect a lot of work goes into this Mass by the Liturgy Team. If you want to 'hear', celebrate the Mass I invite you to come into the Church, or at least gather around the front door. There will be no use of a sound system that will reach the 'four corners' of the cemetery.

Individual Graves: The Mass itself, is offered for all buried in our cemetery and the prayer of blessing refers to all buried 'in this cemetery. To that end there is no need for all graves to be individually sprinkled and nor will that happen. What I will do after the Mass is 'sprinkle' the different sections of the graveyard. Why not bring a small bottle of holy water and sprinkle your family grave during the Mass. Fr. Michael Carey
