Sunday, 23rd September - Diocesan Safeguarding Day

The fourth Sunday in September has being designated by Archbishop Diarmuid Martin as Safeguarding Sunday. It is an ideal opportunity to let the parishioners in our parishes know of the great work going on to safeguard children and vulnerable adults. As Pope Francis has said "Families need to know that the Church is making every effort to protect their children"

This year saw the introduction of the new updated Diocesan Safeguarding Policy, which was launched at Deanery meetings throughout the Dioceses. This document clearly outlines the policies and procedures that all parishes must have in place to safeguard children. Should anyone want a copy of this document, it can be downloaded from the Dublin Diocesan Child Safeguarding & Protection Service website or alternatively, you can contact any member of the Parish team, who in turn will email you a copy. The measures that we put in place in this parish, as in all parishes in the diocese, to keep children and vulnerable adults safe

- Adopting a child centered approach, which involves valuing children and demonstrating our respect for them
- Obtaining the consent of parents for the involvement of their children in parish activities
- Choosing carefully those who work with children and vulnerable adults in our parish
- Ensuring parish workers and volunteers behave appropriately towards children and vulnerable adults.
- Making proper arrangements for activities involving children, including ensuring adequate adult supervision of such activities
- Keeping good records of parish activities involving children.

CHILD SAFEGUARDING IN OUR PARISH

Church Safeguarding & Protection Statement

We the Parish of Brackenstown value and encourage the participation of children and young people in Parish liturgies and activities in order to enhance their spiritual, physical, emotional, intellectual and

We recognise the dignity and rights of all children and young people and are committed to ensuring

The recognity forms of abuse and exploitation.

In keeping with this we will do all in our power to create safe environments for children and young people in order to secure their protection and enable their full participation in the life of the Parish. This is a commitment binding on all Priests and on all those who work and volunteer in this Parish.

Child Protection Code of Conduct

Within the Parish of St. Cronan's, Brackenstown:

- Children and young people will be treated with courtesy, respect and dignity
- Children and young people (under eighteen years of age) will not be permitted to consume alcohol or smoke while participating in activities organised by or under the control of the Parish
- ullet There will be an adequate ratio of leaders to children and young people at all times
- Care will be taken to ensure that when working with mixed gender groups, staff and adult volunteers of appropriate gender will work in pairs
- Leaders (over the age of eighteen) will not consume alcohol or smoke while in the presence of children or young people
- Inappropriate language or sexually suggestive comments will not be permitted by children or young people
- Physical contact between children or young people and leaders will be appropriate at all times. Leaders
 will not engage in rough play or undertake any task of a personal nature with / for children or young
 people, except in cases of medical necessity when the welfare of the child or young person depends on it
- Leaders will always engage with children or young people in an open manner and care will be taken not to show favouritism
- There will be clearly designated leaders within each group with whom children and young people can speak about their experiences and raise any concerns should they arise




St. Joseph's Young Priests Society Supporting Vocations to the Priesthood Worldwide

Helping Children

to Enjoy Mass

As we look at the big effort of a Sunday morning, what helps young parents be encouraged to bring children to mass? Going with kids can be daunting. To keep doing something uncomfortable, or embarrassing, seems counter-intuitive. Parishes can do huge things for families. Ours has 'Pew Packs': folders with crayons, kids' readings, even a book inside. My small children go in and grab them, and it provides something



for them in the environment. Not every parish can manage this kind of innovation - or the lollipop afterwards, which acts as the perennial carrot to the grumpy toddler. These simple gestures of welcome and hospitality are gratefully received. Children are usually welcome at our parishes

- more than that, there are usually really kind-hearted and gifted people who would love to 'do something' for kids. We should seek those people out - they are around, the ones who smile at kids and say nice things to parents like us - and see what ideas they might have.

Whether or not we have the blessings of a lollipop or resources for the little ones, our children are likely to inherit our attitude towards the mass. If we groan and sigh and 'put up with it', zombie like, trying to sneak out as soon as possible, then they will also. But, if we are loving and reverent, taking the time to talk about the gospel afterwards, or share with enthusiasm our love for the Lord in the Eucharist, then the kids will look forward to it as well.
