Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2017

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is observed from the 18th to the 25th January – the octave of St. Peter and St. Paul.

There are many reasons to celebrate this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The resources have been prepared by the Churches in Germany as they mark the 500th anniversary of the German Reformation. This year's material they prepared for worldwide use are based around the verses 2 Corinthians 5:14-20.

There are fifty million Christians in Germany who, traditionally, have mostly belonged to the Roman Catholic Church or one of the Protestant State Churches. Recent developments, particularly the reception of refugees and asylum seekers, have begun to change this balance and other Christian traditions are finding expression. Whilst that which unites the churches is stronger than that which divides, there are still areas of difference in which the churches remain self-absorbed or construct new walls.

The text from 2 Corinthians announces that God has, in Christ, reconciled the world to himself. - The love of Christ compels us to be ambassadors of this reconciliation, which is enacted by dismantling the walls. With the fall of the Berlin Wall, Germany experienced how a seemingly insurmountable wall could be brought down. -The fall of this wall is a symbol of hope that, with the love of God, nothing is impossible.

This is a time of great change and uncertainty around the world as we confront difficulties such as climate change, migration of peoples across the planet and conflict spreading in many places. In the European context we see many of these issues finding expression on our streets and these are indeed a cause for prayers for unity.

The Service to mark the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in the Swords area will take place in St. Columba's Church on at 8:00pm on Wednesday 25th January (The Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul). At a time when there is so much division in our world and where the message of God is being used as a tool of violence, there is a great need for those of different parts of the Christian family to come together and pray.

Brackenstown Bible Study 2017

During 2017 we will study Jeff Cavins 23 week DVD course "The Bible Timeline; The Story of Salvation" The course will consist of 12 classes in the spring and 11 classes in the autumn. Brackenstown Parish Pilgrimage to the Camino de Santiago

Stage 5 (final stage) of the Camino Francés

Sarria to Santiago - 110 km (8 days)

Saturday 1 – Saturday 8 July 2017

This is the full and final stage of the Camino Way. It takes 5 days walking to complete, it averages out at approx. 22 km per day and qualifies you for the Compostela (certificate). The trail is a combination of small country roads, stone footpaths and well maintained compact dirt tracks with no really steep climbs or treacherous descents. It is strenuous enough to give a sense of achievement at the end of each day without being exhausted! This walk is suitable for everyone and anyone who is reasonably fit but, most importantly, stamina is required.

Accommodation

Your accommodation will be in 2/3* hotels/pensions while walking. Your en suite room will be simple, basic and clean. Facilities generally consist of a reception area and a breakfast room. Some have restaurant facilities. Breakfast is usually of the continental variety - coffee and croissants – anything else is bonus! As we use a wide range of accommodations in the various overnight locations you will be advised of names of all accommodations with your travel documents. The 2 final nights in Santiago will be in a good centrally located 4* hotel.

Walking each day: you are "independent" which means you have maximum flexibility – set off walking in the morning whenever you are ready, walk at your own pace, choose when and where to stop for lunch en route and plan the day around your own agenda. You simply leave your packed luggage at reception and it will be awaiting you on arrival in your next accommodation.

YOU CAN DO IT!

We will have preparation walks in the Parish before we go. The important thing to know is that you go at your own pace and anybody who enjoys walking in beautiful scenery will be able for this. The steepest section would be the same as walking from Applewood to Brackenstown Road, there is no gradient any steeper.

The full itinerary is on the Parish website and available from the Parish Office. I have done this part of the Camino before and will be happy to share my experience with you.


