## PARTNERSHIP OF BRACKENSTOWN, SWORDS, RIVER VALLEY & DONABATE PARISHES

21ST SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME 25th SEPTEMBER 2024

This Sunday, World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, marks the beginning of the Season of Creation, which runs to the feast of St. Francis of Assisi on 4th October. As part of the Parish's initial ecological action plan and in promotion of the message contained in the Holy Father's encyclical "Laudato Si'" we have been looking for ways to increase biodiversity in our Parish. To this end we identified two suitable areas within the grounds of Saint Cronan's Church campus: the pastoral centre garden and the lawn area between the entry and exit gates. We allowed the lawns in these two areas to remain uncut for 12 weeks during the summer to encourage pollinators and other wildlife. This proved to be quite successful, and we were pleasantly surprised to discover that we had so many wildflower species already present in our lawns, especially in the pastoral centre lawn.

In the front lawn area, we found a large patch of Cuckoo Flower/ Lady's Smock (photo 1) which is the host plant for the caterpillar of the Orange Tip Butterfly (photo 2). We hope to facilitate an expansion in the area in which Cuckoo Flowers are present and to

provide an attractive future habitat for the Orange Tip Butterfly. The various wildflower species attracted large numbers of bees. Bumble bees do not make honey and because of this they have no way of storing food. This means that they are always only a couple of days away from starvation, unless there is a nearby food source.

We propose adding selected native flowering & fruit bearing shrubs to our hedges as opportunities arise. These will provide food for bees, insects and birds as well as shelter for wildlife in general. Recently we had to remove six large Leylandii trees (photo 3) from the rear of Fr. Joseph's house as they had outgrown the available space. We intend to plant a biodiversity-friendly Blackthorn hedge (photos 4 & 5) in place of the Leylandii.

Following the success of the solar panels on the church roof in curbing carbon emissions, as well as reducing our energy bills, we have now installed solar panels on the roof of each of the parish houses. We are open to other ideas parishioners may have in relation to the care of creation and will be happy to welcome new members at our next meeting of our Care for Creation Committee on Monday 9th September at 7.30pm in the Pastoral Centre.
