the beautiful display in our church in the past week or two to mark the season of Creation. Since 2017, Pope Francis has declared the period between 1st September (World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation) and 4th October, Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, as the 'Season of Creation'. In his encyclical, Laudato Si, published five years ago, Pope Francis links the 'cry of the poor' with the 'cry of the earth'. The theme of this year's season, 'Listen to the Voice of Creation', draws its inspiration from the story of Moses and the Burning Bush: 'I have heard their cry... I know their sufferings... Come, now! I will send you... I will be with you' (Exodus 3: 1-12).

Word from St. Paul 'There should be prayers offered for everyone - petitions, intercessions and thanksgiving - and especially for those in intercessions and thanksgiving - and especially for those in

authority...', so writes St. Paul in this Sunday's second reading from the First Letter to Timothy. The advice might seem pretty straightforward. Our central act as a Christian community is to gather each Sunday to listen to God's word and to celebrate Eucharist. But we also pray with and for one another, and indeed for all of God's people. When we hear of someone who is ill, facing an exam or taking on a new challenge, we often light a candle for them or send a Mass card. It is a practical expression of our support and encouragement. But in asking us to pray 'for those in authority', Paul is going further. There is a tendency to criticise people in leadership roles, whether at work or in school, in church or civil life. Honest criticism is fair but sometimes it can slip into a personalised attack on an individual. Instead, Paul advises that we should pray for those in positions of responsibility, as well as for those with whom we don't get on. The act of praying for someone changes how we regard them. We begin to see them as God sees them. It is often a first step on the road to forgiveness and reconciliation. Hence Paul concludes: 'In every place, then, I want people to lift their hands up reverently in prayer, with no anger or argument." Fr. Richard




