THE SYNOD ON THE FAMILY - THE NEXT STAGE

Archbishop Diarmuid Martin has invited priests and parishioners to take part in a diocesan wide discussion process in advance of the Synod of the Family this year.

Archbishop Martin will attend the second session of the Synod, called by Pope Francis, in Rome this October on the theme "The Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and Contemporary World".

In a letter to priests and parishes the Archbishop said it was the desire of Pope Francis that God's people around the world should have an opportunity to make their contribution to the process. He said: "Worldwide, there is a great appreciation of the fact that Pope Francis wanted to hear the sentiments of God's people on the theme of the Synod. I believe, we owe it to Pope Francis to use this opportunity for reflection – and indeed a new model of Church practice – which he offers."

It is anticipated that this widespread reflection and discussion process will take place in parishes during the months of February and March. Each Parish is to determine how that discussion should take place.

The responses of each parish are expected back with Diocesan Office for Evangelisation and Ecumenism before the end of March 2015, so that a consolidated report of the Irish Church can be prepared in time to prepare the formal working document of the Synod.

Archbishop Martin said there is an important distinction between purposes of the two Synods which should be reflected in the discussion process. He said the aim of the extraordinary Synod, held last year was to gather factual information about the situation of the marriage and the family in our times. The aim of the Ordinary Synod of 2015 is to take up the conclusions of the extraordinary Synod and begin to reflect on how Church pastoral services to support marriage and family life, should be strengthened and renewed.

The questions and resources will be taken by the Parish Pastoral Council and like the reflection evening that we had in preparation for the "Extraordinary Synod on the Family" they will facilitate a gathering, discussion, bring together the points raised and submit them to be part of the Irish Church's document.

CHURCH UNITY WEEK

Today our week of prayer for Church Unity draws to a close. Each morning we prayed during the daily Mass for greater co-operation and understanding between the Christian Churches and that the bonds of friendship and support that we have here in the Swords area may continue to strengthen.

Thanks to Addy Patterson and the community of St. Columba's Parish for hosting this years' Service for the Swords area. It was great to see so many representatives from the Parishes of Swords, Rivervalley and ourselves gathered to pray. In her reflection Rev. Ása Björk Ólafsdóttir, using the meeting of Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well, spoke about God as being like the well, an extraordinary depth that when we dip out finger into it, we only touch the surface. If we continue to live our faith alone, our depth of understanding God will remain at the surface, but each time we work with others we go deeper into our understanding of God and God's action in our lives. This has been borne out in the cooperation between the Churches and people in the Dun Laoighre area where she ministers and where the outreach to the homeless, isolated, and addicts through the "Dining Room" lunch facility has grown and developed in such a short time. When we stop with our own plans and allow God to give direction, then God also provides the means to accomplish what needs to be done.

The concluding prayer of the Service is one that we could keep in mind throughout the year: God, with us and walking in our midst, grant us the grace of your light and Spirit. May we continue your mission, remaining faithful, welcoming all and listening even to those who are different from ourselves. Take and use these gifts in the service of your kingdom. Take away the violence that is in our hearts and the discriminating attitudes that exclude and devalue the dignity of others. Enable our churches to be welcoming spaces where feast and forgiveness, joy and tenderness, strength and faith, become our daily practice, our daily food, our daily movement forward in Jesus Christ. Amen.
